

Y our wedding gown is something you will remember for the rest of your life...and should make you feel and look good. After all, you are the center of attention! The same could be said about gowns for your entire bridal party.

For many brides-to-be, price is the biggest factor in determining which gowns to wear. For some, style is key to making a purchase. As for others, it is *pure emotion!* 

Either way, you need to make smart, educated decisions about the gowns for you and your bridal party. By establishing guidelines and a set of priorities, you can make your search for the perfect gowns a lot easier.

#### The most important questions are:

#### What kind of wedding is planned?

The styles you choose will depend on the formality and style of the wedding itself. Typically, the more formal the wedding, the more formal your gowns should be for you, the bride, bridesmaids, flower girl and usherettes.

#### What is your wedding date?

The wedding date is critical since some fabrics and styles are seasonally and some gowns might not be comfortable for the weather temperature at the time of your wedding.

Many gowns are special orders and require much as four months for delivery. Even if you purchase gowns that are ready for immediate shipment, it may still require time for alterations.

#### How much can you spend?

Establish how much you have to spend on your wedding gown and have an idea on how much your bridal party members can afford for their gowns. They will also need to purchase accessories, such as headpieces, shoes, gloves and jewellery. Their package could average \$300.

The average price brides are willing to spend on a wedding gown is \$900. Add headpiece, veil, shoes, jewellery and the price will easily exceed \$1,200 for the bride's complete attire. To save a few hundred dollars, consider renting a gown which range from \$250 to \$400.

Finally, visit a bridal store that carries top designer styles you prefer.

#### **Wedding Ceremony**


Father of the bride usually gives the bride away. However, other relatives, such as a stepfather, brother, uncle or even your mother, may give a bride away in marriage.

If your parents are divorced, your father may still perform this task, if you wish. It's a good idea to have a discussion with your stepfather beforehand on this matter.

#### Seating at the Ceremony

Individual circumstances usually determine seating at the ceremony, but it's most important that everyone feels comfortable and happy with the arrangements. The pew reserved for the couple's family is often marked with flowers or ribbons at the front.

Other guests are next seated from front to back as they enter. Latearriving guests should slip into back rows. Ushers must supervise seating arrangements.



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



### Tux styles are "endless"

The bride has always been the star of a wedding celebration. However, the groom is beginning to receive more attention, thanks for the most part, to the many fabulous choices in men's formal-wear.

Even though tuxedos aren't the only option on the board from which to choose, they are the favourite choice for weddings.

When one thinks of tuxedos, the first thing that comes to mind is James Bond: seated near his arch nemesis in a casino, tossing poker chips across the table with a devil-may-care expression on his face. The second thing about a tuxedo is an upscale wedding. Almost every couple wants to look and feel like royalty, and willing to spend a little more to achieve their desire.

A suit is traditionally worn to the office, at job interviews and for a wedding guest, while a tuxedo stands alone as something only worn on very special occasions. The biggest difference between a tux and a suit is the presence of satin on a tux; a suit does not. Satin appears on the lapels, buttons and pocket lining of the tuxedo jacket, as well as a strip of satin down each pant leg. In contrast, suits have plastic or cloth-covered buttons and no satin whatever.

Tuxedos may also have additional components like a cummerbund or vest, while a suit may or may not be accompanied by a vest or suspenders.

The contemporary groom has let loose from those restrictions that were all too common in previous years, allowing for a more personal approach to his formal wear. This wedding season will be an exposé of mixing colours, self-declaration, and exploration into the styles of the past, with a touch of what is modern.

What's underneath the tuxedo jacket has become the focal point to accomplishing a look of reverence mixed with style. The most common colours this spring are: *purple, aqua, royal blue, pink, and green in either earth tones or brighter shades.* 

In wearing a 3-piece tuxedo, more often the vest is suited to complement the stitching of the jacket, while the tux accessories match the dresses. This makes the overall appearance of the tux stand out.

There is a vintage theme emerging into men's wedding formalwear – the 1920's style has reappeared, whether tux or suit. Men are back to a tight-fitting, single-breasted jacket with one or two buttons, and narrow tuxedo pants that aren't tapered. A double-breasted jacket or scissor-tails will sneak into the mix, occasionally.

Even though an admiration of the classic style has returned, grooms can wear a variety of tux colours regardless of the time of year. Don't anticipate any real neglect to standards of tux colours: *Black, white, ivory, greys, blues and more*. Look for all of them, and, oh, don't forget the shoes! It's all about the shoes noaways.

Typically, you should go with a lighter coloured tuxedo for warmer weather, like in the Bahamas, but the dark colours have become iconic and always makes a big splash for every formal event; mixed with the right blend of colour ties and vests, dark colour tux can be perfect for a wedding.

There's no longer a desire for plain, boring men's formal attire. There are many transitions to the tux styles, from classic to existing fashion, and even a mix of the two. Expect a new and stylish group of groomsmen this season.

The bride will likely be wearing the most expensive and amazing dress she's ever worn on the wedding day. Hence, the groom will definitely want to complement the bride's attire.

Minister to Bride: (Bride's name), in placing this ring on (Groom's Name) finger, repeat after me: (Groom's Name), you are now consecrate to me as my husband from this day forward and I give you this ring as the pledge of my love and as the symbol of our unity and with this ring, I thee wed.

#### Pronouncement

Minister: In as much as (Groom's name) and (Bride's name) have consented together in marriage before this company of friends and family and have pledged their faith, and declared their unity by giving and receiving a ring, are now joined. You have pronounced yourselves husband and wife, but remember to always be each other's best friend.

What, therefore, God has joined together, let no man put asunder.

By the power vested in me by the Commonwealth of the Bahamas and Almighty God, I now pronounce you man and wife. May your days be good and long upon the earth.

You (the groom) may now kiss the bride.





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
