No matter the times, the demands of the Gospels of Jesus Christ remain the same.

They are as timely as ever.

They are never out of season.

We are commanded in Matthew 25:

"35 For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in.

"³⁶ I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me.'

³⁷ "Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when did we see you hungry and feed you, or thirsty and give you something to drink?

"38 When did we see you a stranger and invite you in, or needing clothes and clothe you? 39 When did we see you sick or in prison and go to visit you?"

⁴⁰ "The King will reply, 'Truly I tell you, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me."

As you celebrate your 25th anniversary, I invite you to continue to meet the demands of the Gospel in helping to minister to God's people, in mind, body and soul.

You are also called to a great spiritual ministry.

Some time ago I was talking to one of our elders.

She told me that she thought that too many older people complained too much about younger people.

She went on to say that too many adults did not take enough time with or did not properly mentor the young people in our Bahamas.

Her lesson to me was this:

Instead of complaining too much about our young people, let us help do all we can

to nourish and encourage them in the faith and as citizens of the Bahamas.

As you embark on your next 25 years as a community of faith, let me offer you these words of Isaiah 40:31:

"...Those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength.

They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.

Continue to dwell in the strength and the house of the Lord as you continue your ministry of love and hope and healing and reconciliation.

Allow me to offer as my closing prayer, these words from a well-known hymn.

This is my wish for you as continue to grow from strength to strength.

"You who dwell in the shelter of the Lord, Who abide in His shadow for life, Say to the Lord, 'My Refuge, My Rock in Whom I trust.'

"And He will raise you up on eagle's wings,
Bear you on the breath of dawn,
Make you to shine like the sun,

And hold you in the palm of His Hand.

"The snare of the fowler will never capture you,

And famine will bring you no fear;

Under His Wings your refuge,

His faithfulness your shield."

May God continue to bless your pastoral team and your community of faith as you grow stronger, go deeper and reach higher.
